Using Apostrophes Correctly

There are two causes for using an apostrophe:

I. To show possession/ownership

E.g. That is Katy's DVD.



2. In contractions (when two words are shortened into one word)

E.g. | Isn*t that your classroom? [Is + not = isn't]
